


## To use the printer safely

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
- ⚠ The fusing unit becomes extremely hot during operation. Wait until it has cooled down sufficiently before replacing consumable items.



The fusing unit is marked with the caution label. Please do NOT take off or damage the label.



- ⚠ There are high voltage electrodes inside the printer. Before you clean the printer, clear a paper jam or replace parts, make sure you have turned off the power switch and unplugged the printer from the AC power outlet/socket.



- ⚠ Do not handle the plug with wet hands - this constitutes an electric shock hazard.




- ⚠ This printer is heavy and weighs approximately 31.5 kg (69.4 lb). When you move or lift this printer, make sure at least two people lift it together. Be careful not to trap your fingers when you set the machine back down.

-  If the printer becomes hot, blows smoke, or generates obscure odor, immediately turn off the power switch and unplug the printer from the AC power outlet/socket. Call your dealer or Brother Customer Service.
-  If metal objects, water or other liquids get inside the printer, immediately turn off the power switch and unplug the printer from the AC power outlet/socket. Call your dealer or Brother Customer Service.
-  Do not put consumable items such as the toner cartridges and the waste toner pack into a fire. Some consumable items can be flammable under certain conditions.
-  Do not look directly at the laser beam light. It might cause damage to your eyesight. Do not remove or break open the printer's safety interlocks.
-  Do not run the printer with the top cover, front cover and back covers open and the interlocks removed.
-  Do not place any items on the printer.

## Printer do's and don'ts for optimum print quality

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- ❗ Before you move or lift the printer, remove the toner cartridges, waste toner pack and fusing unit to avoid spills. Be sure to keep the printer as level as possible. Damage caused by failure to remove the supplies may void your warranty.
- ❗ Do not touch the rollers of the fusing unit. This can degrade print quality.



**IMPORTANT: For technical and operational help, you must call the country where you bought the printer. Calls must be made *from within* that country.**





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# 1 About this printer

## What is in the box?



\*1 The toner cartridges that come supplied with this printer, are starter toners.

Starter toners, are toner cartridges with up to half the life of the standard toner cartridge, 5000 pages (Black) and 3000 pages (Cyan, Magenta and Yellow) at approximately 5% print coverage (A4 or Letter size).

\*2 In Europe these parts are in the Localization Kit.

\*3 Repacking kit is to be used ONLY for moving or shipping the printer. Localization Kit.

 Depending on the country you live in and the HL-2700CN series model bought, you may have additional parts not listed above.

 The OPC belt cartridge is packed inside a separate box as a starter kit. Wait to unpack the OPC belt cartridge until immediately before you put it in the printer. Exposure to direct sunlight or room light may damage the OPC belt cartridge.

 We recommend keeping spares of the following consumable items at all times. When these are exhausted, the printer may stop printing.

- Toner cartridges (TN-04BK, TN-04C, TN-04M, TN-04Y)
- Waste toner pack (WT-4CL)
- OPC belt cartridge (OP-4CL)

### **Interface cable**

- An interface cable is not a standard accessory.
- Some computers have a USB and a parallel port. Please buy the appropriate cable for the interface you are going to use.
- Most parallel cables support bi-directional communication, but some might have an incompatible pin assignment or may not be IEEE 1284 compliant.
- It is recommended to use a parallel interface cable or USB interface cable that is no longer than 6 feet (2 meters).
- When you use a USB cable, make sure it is a high-speed twisted cable (12 Mbps or 480 Mbps), and that you connect it to the USB connector of your PC.
- Please make sure that you use a Hi-Speed USB 2.0 certified cable if your computer uses a Hi-Speed USB 2.0 interface.
- Do not connect the USB cable to a non-powered hub or Mac<sup>®</sup> Keyboard.

 Depending on the country where you bought the printer, the power cord may differ slightly from the one shown in Figure 1-1.

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


# Features

This printer has the following standard features.

## 2400 DPI class resolution

This printer prints at a default resolution of 600 dots per inch (dpi). You can get a higher print quality, equivalent to 2400 dpi class resolution by using Brother technologies: High Resolution Control (HRC) and Color Advanced Photoscale Technology (CAPT).

## High speed and color laser printing

You can print crisp images in brilliant 24-bit color.

This printer can print at speeds up to 29 pages per minute in monochrome mode and 8 pages per minute in full color mode. The HL-2700CN controller uses a high speed 64-bit RISC microprocessor and special hardware chips, to ensure fast print job processing.

## Color Advanced Photoscale Technology (CAPT)

This printer can print graphics in 256 shades for each color in PCL6 emulation and BR-Script3, producing nearly photographic quality. CAPT is most effective when printing photographic images.

## High Resolution Control (HRC)

The High Resolution Control (HRC) technology gives you clear and crisp printouts and improves even 600-dpi resolution output. HRC is most effective when printing text.

## Maintenance-free and economical toner cartridge

This printer uses four easy-to-replace toner cartridges. The toner cartridges can print up to 6,600 (Cyan, Magenta and Yellow) and 10,000 (Black) single-sided pages at approximately 5% coverage.

## Universal paper tray

This printer loads paper automatically from the paper tray. Since the paper tray is a universal type, a number of different paper sizes (one paper size at a time) can be used. Even envelopes can be loaded from the paper tray. For detailed paper specifications, see *What kind of paper can I use?* on page 1-10.

## Three interfaces

This printer has a high speed, bi-directional parallel, a Hi-Speed USB 2.0, and an Ethernet 10/100BASE-TX interface.

If your application software supports the bi-directional parallel interface, you can monitor the printer status. It is fully compatible with the industry-standard bi-directional parallel interface.

The Brother network board is factory installed in the HL-2700CN, which enables you to use this printer in the TCP/IP, IPS/SPX, AppleTalk, DLC/LLC and NetBEUI environments. Also, many useful utilities, such as BRAdmin Professional utility for the administrator and Brother network printing software, are included in the CD-ROM supplied with the HL-2700CN printer. For setup, see the *Network User's Guide*, which is provided on the CD-ROM.

## Automatic Interface Selection

This printer can automatically select the bi-directional parallel, USB or Ethernet 10/100BASE-TX interface, depending on the interface port through which it receives data. With this feature, you can connect the printer to more than one computer. See *Automatic Interface Selection* on page 2-20.

## Five emulation modes

This printer can emulate PCL 5C and PCL 6 language printers, Brother BR-Script3 printers, HP-GL plotter as well as EPSON FX-850 and IBM Proprinter XL printers (for monochrome printing only). You can print with all application programs that support one of these printers. See *About emulation modes* on page 3-21.

## Automatic Emulation Selection

This printer can automatically select the printer emulation mode, depending on the print commands it receives from the computer software. With this feature, many users can share the printer on a network. See *Automatic Emulation Selection* on page 2-19.

## Data compression technology

This printer can internally compress the received graphics and font data in its memory so it can print larger graphics and more fonts without the need for additional memory.

## Fonts

This printer has 66 scalable and 12 bitmapped fonts. The fonts that can be used vary according to the selected emulation mode.

In PCL mode, you can also print the 13 kinds of bar codes listed below. In BR-Script mode, the printer has 35 scalable fonts.

## **Panel lock setting**

If the panel button settings have been changed, the printer may not work as you expect. If you are an administrator of this printer, you can lock your settings to prevent changes from being made. See *SETUP* on page 3-12.

## **Power Save Mode**

This printer has a power saving mode. Since laser printers consume power to keep the fixing assembly at a high temperature, this feature can save electricity when the printer is on but not being used. The factory setting of the power save mode is **ON** so that it complies with the new EPA Energy Star specification.

## **Toner Save Mode**

This printer has an economical toner save mode. By using this feature you can substantially reduce operating costs and extend the life expectancy of the toner cartridges.

## **Reprint setting**

The printer saves data that you want reprinted. You can reprint a document without sending the data again from your PC. If you do not install a CompactFlash® card, you can reprint from RAM. See *Reprint setting* on page 3-26.

When there is not enough memory to print the last job, you can reprint the last print page.

## **Network**

Ethernet 10/100BASE-TX enables you to use the printer in the following environments:

(TCP/IP, IPX/SPX, AppleTalk, DLC/LLC, NetBEUI)

Also, many useful utilities, such as BRAdmin Professional Utility, Driver Deployment Wizard and Web BRAdmin software for the Network administrator, are included. For details of the utilities, see the documentation included on the CD-ROM. See *Software for Networks* on page 2-18.

# Positioning the printer

Please read the following before you use the printer.

## Power Supply

---

Use the printer within the recommended power range.

AC power:  $\pm 10\%$  of the rated power voltage

Frequency: 50/60 Hz (120 V or 220-240 V)

The power cord, including extensions, should not exceed 5 meters (16½ feet).

Do not share the same power circuit with other high-power appliances, such as an air conditioner, copier, shredder and so on. If you cannot avoid using the printer with these appliances, we recommend that you use a voltage transformer or a high-frequency noise filter.

Use a voltage regulator if the power source is not stable.

## Environment

---


- Make sure that the power outlet/socket is near the printer and is easy to get to so that, if there is an emergency, it can be easily unplugged.
- Use the printer only within the following ranges of temperature and humidity:

Temperature: 10 °C to 32.5 °C (50 °F to 90.5 °F)

Humidity: 20% to 80% (without condensation)

- Do not put the printer where the ventilation hole of the printer is blocked. Keep a gap of approximately 100 mm (4 in.) between the ventilation hole and the wall.
- The printer should be used in a well-ventilated room.
- Put the printer on a flat, horizontal surface.
- Keep the printer clean. Do not put the printer in a dusty place.
- Do not put the printer in direct sunlight. If you have to put it near a window, use a blind or a heavy curtain to protect the printer from direct sunlight.
- Do not put the printer near devices that contain magnets or generate magnetic fields.
- Do not subject the printer to strong physical shocks or vibrations.
- Do not expose the printer to open/naked flames or salty or corrosive gasses.
- Do not put objects on top of the printer.
- Do not put the printer near an air conditioner.
- Keep the printer horizontal when you carry it.
- Do not place anything on top of the power cord including this machine. Do not allow the power cord to be stepped on.

The following figure details the recommended area around the printer for proper ventilation, operation and maintenance.

- Make sure that there is enough space behind the printer so you can easily access the back cover or duplex unit if a paper jam occurs.
- Make sure the paper tray does not extend past the edge of the table where the printer is located.

# What kind of paper can I use?

## Type and size of paper

---

The printer loads paper from the installed standard paper tray, optional lower tray, or the optional legal tray.

### Standard paper tray

Since the standard paper tray is a universal type, you can use any of the paper sizes (one paper size at a time) listed in table 1 in *Media type, paper size and number of sheets for paper source* on page 1-11. The tray can hold up to 250 sheets of paper (75 g/m<sup>2</sup> or 20 lb) or up to 15 envelopes (paper can be loaded up to the top line of the sliding guide).

### Optional lower tray (LT-27CL)

The optional lower tray can hold up to 530 sheets of paper (75 g/m<sup>2</sup> or 20 lb). The maximum capacity is 44 mm paper height.

### Optional legal tray (LT-27LG)

The optional legal tray can hold up to 250 sheets of paper (75 g/m<sup>2</sup> or 20 lb). If you want to print on legal size paper, you must use this tray. You can use the optional legal tray as a standard paper tray (Tray 1). See *Legal tray (LT-27LG)* on page 4-5.





## Guidelines for selecting paper

---

The printer is designed to work well with most types of xerographic and bond paper. However, some paper variables may have an effect on print quality or handling reliability. Always test samples of paper before purchasing to ensure desirable performance. Some important guidelines when selecting paper are:

- Supplier should be informed that the paper or envelopes will be used in a laser printer.
  - Preprinted paper must use inks that can withstand the temperature of the printer's fusing process. (200 degrees centigrade)
  - If you have selected a cotton bond paper, paper having a rough surface, such as cockle or laid finished paper or paper that is wrinkled or puckered, the paper may exhibit degraded performance.
-  The manufacturer does not recommend the use of any particular paper. The operator is responsible for the quality of paper used with the printer.

### Types of paper to avoid

Some types of paper may not perform well or may cause damage to your printer.

Do not use paper:

- that is highly textured
- that is extremely smooth or shiny
- that is curled or warped
- that is coated or has a chemical finish
- that is damaged, creased or folded
- that exceeds the recommended weight specification in this guide
- with tabs and staples
- with letterheads using low temperature dyes or thermography
- that is multipart or carbonless
- that is designed for inkjet printing




### Types of envelopes to avoid

Do not use envelopes:


- that are damaged, curled, wrinkled, or an unusual shape
- that are extremely shiny or textured
- with clasps, snaps or tie strings
- with self-adhesive closures
- that are of a baggy construction
- that are not sharply creased
- that are embossed (have raised writing on them)
- that were previously printed by a laser printer
- that are pre-printed on the inside
- that cannot be arranged when put in a pile
- that are made of paper that weighs more than the paper weight specifications for the printer
- that have been badly made, with edges that are not straight or consistently square
- with windows, holes, cut-outs or perforations
- with sealing flaps that have not been folded at purchase
- with sealing flaps as shown in Figure 1-7
- with three or more layers of paper in the marked area in Figure 1-8 or




**Figure 1-9**

- with each side folded as shown in Figure 1-9

Before you put envelopes in the tray, check the following:

- Envelopes should have a lengthwise sealing flap.
- The sealing flaps should be folded crisply and correctly (irregularly cut or folded envelopes may cause paper jams).

- Envelopes should consist of two layers of paper in the area circled in Figure 1-10.

If you use any of the types of envelopes listed above, they may damage your printer. This damage is not covered under any Brother warranty or service agreement.

- Before you print envelopes, you must 'fan' the stack to avoid paper jams and misfeeds.
- Before you print a lot of envelopes, test one to make sure that the print results are what you want.
- Envelope joints that are sealed by the manufacturer should be secure.
- Do not put different types of paper in the paper tray at the same time because it may cause paper jams or misfeeds.
- For proper printing, you must choose the same paper size from your software application as the paper in the tray.
- An area 15 mm (0.6 in.) from the edges of the envelope will not be printed.
- See *What kind of paper can I use?* on page 1-10.

Most envelopes will be suitable for your printer. However, some envelopes will have feed and print-quality problems because of the way they have been made. A suitable envelope should have edges with straight, well-creased folds and the leading edge should not be thicker than two pieces of paper. The envelope should lie flat and not be of baggy or flimsy construction. You should buy quality envelopes from a supplier who understands that you will be using the envelopes in a laser printer.

- Brother will not recommend a particular envelope because envelope manufacturers may change the envelope specifications. You are responsible for the quality and performance of the envelopes you use.

## Labels and transparencies

The printer will print on most types of labels and transparencies designed for use with a laser printer. Labels should have an adhesive which is acrylic-based since such material is more stable at the high temperatures in the fusing unit. Adhesives should not come in contact with any part of the printer, because the label stock may stick to the drum or rollers and cause jams and print quality problems. No adhesive should be exposed between the labels. Labels should be arranged so that they cover the entire length and width of the sheet. Using labels with spaces may result in labels peeling off and causing serious jams or print problems.

All labels and transparencies used in this printer must be able to withstand a temperature of 200 degrees centigrade (392 degrees Fahrenheit) for a period of 0.1 seconds.

Label and transparency sheets should not exceed the paper weight specifications described in this User's Guide. Labels and transparencies exceeding this specification may not feed or print properly and may cause damage to your printer.

Transparencies and Labels can be fed from Tray 1 only and cannot be printed using the duplex unit.

### Types of labels and transparencies to avoid

Do not use labels or transparencies that are damaged, curled, wrinkled or an unusual shape.



Before using paper that has holes in it, such as organizer sheets, you must 'fan' the stack to avoid paper jams and misfeeds.

- Avoid feeding labels with the carrier sheet exposed because your printer will be damaged.
- When feeding transparencies, use the recommended type for *laser* printers. For detailed information on the specification of the proper transparencies to purchase, call your dealer or Brother Customer Service.



Brother will not recommend particular labels or transparencies because the manufacturers may change the specifications. You are responsible for the quality and performance of the print media you use.

# Paper feed

## Tray feed

The printer can feed paper from the standard paper tray, optional lower tray or optional legal tray.



When you put paper into the paper tray, note the following:

- If your application software supports paper size selection on the print menu, you can select it through the software. If your application software does not support it, you can set the paper size in the printer driver or by using the control panel buttons.
- The paper size has been set at the factory to Letter for 120 V models or A4 for 220/240 V models. If you want to use other sizes of paper or envelopes, change the paper size setting in PAGE FORMAT in the FORMAT menu by using the control panel buttons. For paper size selection, see *PRINT MENU* on page 3-13.
- If you use pre-printed paper in the trays, please be sure to put the paper with the printed side face up and the top edge of the paper at the back of the paper tray.

The printer automatically detects the paper size you have put into the paper tray. The printer will prompt you to put the correct size of paper in the tray as follows:

If you want to put a different size of paper into the paper tray from the size that was selected in the paper size setting by using the control panel buttons or in your application software, you can change the paper size setting.



## Manual feed

Since this printer does not have a manual feed or multi purpose tray, you cannot manually feed irregular sized paper. However, this printer has a special manual feed mode using Tray 1 (standard paper tray) to accommodate non-standard paper sizes. You can select this mode with the printer driver or the control panel buttons.

See *PAPER* in Chapter 3 for more information on selecting this setting using the printer control panel buttons.

- 1 When the manual feed command is selected, the printer waits until you put the paper in Tray 1.

- 2 Pull out Tray 1 and put in the paper you are going to use. It may be necessary to remove some or all of the paper stack first, depending on the size of paper in the tray and the size of the paper you wish to print on manually.

- 3 Put Tray 1 back in and press **Go**. The printer will then start printing.



- Print quality may be affected by the type of paper you use and the print image.
- You may experience poor paper feeding during duplex printing.
- You cannot perform continuous duplex printing when MANUAL FEED is on.
- During manual duplex printing, if you leave the printer for more than 5 minutes after the first side has been printed, the printer will reset this setting automatically.

## Paper output

We recommend that you use the face down output tray extension, paper stopper and paper support:

- 1 when printing a lot at any one time
- 2 when using legal sized paper
- 3 if the printed paper appears curled







## Print Quality

### ■ Quality

You can select the following print quality settings.

- Normal      600 dpi class. Recommended for ordinary printing. Good print quality with reasonable print speeds.
- Fine        600 x 600 dpi. Print quality is higher. As a result, there will be more print data than when printing in Normal mode. This also causes longer print processing, data transfer and printing times.
- with CAPT\*    Choosing CAPT in the printer driver produces clearer colors and improves the appearance of print jobs containing photographic images.

\*CAPT (Color Advanced Photoscale Technology)

It uses the color information contained in the image data to control the printed image color level. This results in a more accurate reproduction of the image. With CAPT On, the output resolution will be 2400 dpi class. This mode is recommended to print images and graphics.



Print quality and print speeds are correlated. Higher print quality takes longer to print, while lower print quality takes less time to print.

### ■ Improve Gray Color



## Job Spooling

You can reprint a document without sending the data again from your PC (except for secure printing) because the printer will save data that you specify for reprinting.

- Last Job Reprint: Reprint the last job
- Secure Print: Print the data with a password
- Public: Save the data without a password
- Proof: Save the data and print it

- If you want to prevent other people from using the Reprint setting to print your data, remove the **Use Reprint** check mark in Job Spooling settings.
  - The settings for Job Spooling in the printer driver will take priority over the settings made on the control panel. See *Reprint setting* on page 3-26.

## Sleep Time

When the printer does not receive data for a certain period of time (time-out), it enters sleep mode. Sleep mode acts as though the printer was turned off. The default time-out is 30 minutes. When **Intelligent Sleep Mode** is selected, it is automatically adjusted to the most suitable time-out setting depending on the frequency of your printer use. While the printer is in sleep mode, the printer can still receive data from the computer. Receiving a print file or document automatically wakes up the printer to start printing. Pressing one of the buttons will also wake up the printer.

Sleep mode can be turned off. To turn sleep mode off, go to the **Advanced** tab, select **Device Options** and then select **Sleep Time**. Double-click the word **Sleep Time** in the **Sleep Time** screen, this will allow the **Sleep Time Off** function to appear, click **Sleep Time Off** to stop the printer going into sleep mode. The **Sleep Time Off** function can be hidden by double-clicking the word **Sleep Time** in the **Sleep Time** screen again. We recommend that you keep Sleep mode on for power saving.

## Status Monitor

This reports the printer status (any errors that may happen with the printer) when printing. The default setting for the **Status Monitor** is off. If you would like to turn the status monitor on, go to the **Advanced** tab, select **Device Options** and then select **Status Monitor**.

## **Macro**

You can save a page of a document as a macro to printer memory. Moreover, you can execute the saved macro - in other words, you can use the saved macro as an overlay on any documents. This will save time and increase printing speed for often used information such as forms, company logos, letter head formats or invoices.

## **Page Protection**

**Page Protection** refers to a setting that reserves additional memory for the creation of full page images. Selections are AUTO, OFF, LTR (Letter size paper), A4 or LGL (Legal size paper).

The page protection feature allows the printer to create the full page image to be printed in memory before physically moving the paper through the printer. When the image is very complicated and the printer has to wait to process the image before printing, use this function.



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### BRAdmin Professional utility

The BRAdmin Professional is a utility for managing your Brother network enabled printers that are running under Windows® 95/98/Me, Windows NT® 4.0 and Windows® 2000/XP.

It allows you to easily configure and check the status of your printer on the network.

### Driver Deployment Wizard

This installer includes the Windows® PCL driver and Brother network port driver (LPR and NetBIOS). The administrator should set up the IP address, Gateway and Subnet with BRAdmin Professional utility before using this software.

If the administrator then installs the printer driver and port driver using this software, he can save the file to the file server or send the file by E-mail to users. Then, each user just clicks that file to have the printer driver, port driver, IP address, and so on, automatically copied to their PC.

### Web BRAdmin

The Web BRAdmin software is designed to manage all LAN/WAN Brother network connected devices. By installing the Web BRAdmin server software on a computer running IIS\*, Administrators with a Web browser can connect to the Web BRAdmin server, which then communicates with the device itself. Unlike the BRAdmin Professional utility - which is designed for Windows® systems only - the Web BRAdmin server software can be accessed from any client computer with a web browser that supports Java 2.

## Automatic Emulation Selection

---

This printer has an Automatic Emulation Selection feature. When the printer receives data from the computer, it automatically chooses the emulation mode. This feature has been set at the factory to **ON**.

To get the most out of this laser printer, we recommend that you use the Brother BR-Script3 emulation.

The printer is set to the HP color printer emulation (PCL 5C) mode automatically. Since PCL 5C mode takes the highest priority in the Automatic Emulation Selection, in most cases you can start using the printer as it is with the factory settings.



Emulation modes other than PCL 6, PCL 5C and BR-Script3 are monochrome emulation modes.

You can select the emulation mode manually by using the control panel to access **EMULATION** in the **SETUP** menu. See *SETUP* on page 3-12.



When you use the Automatic Emulation Selection, note the following:

- The EPSON or IBM emulation mode priority must be selected, because the printer cannot distinguish between them. Since the factory setting is EPSON emulation mode, you might need to select the IBM emulation mode by using the control panel to access **EMULATION** in the **SETUP** menu.
- Try Automatic Emulation Selection with your application software or network server. If it does not work properly, select the emulation mode manually by using either the printer control panel buttons or the emulation selection commands from your software.

## Automatic Interface Selection

---

This printer has an Automatic Interface Selection feature. When the printer receives data from the computer, it automatically selects the IEEE 1284 Parallel or the USB interface, whichever is appropriate. When you use the parallel interface, you can turn the high-speed and bi-directional parallel communications on or off by using the control panel buttons to access **PARALLEL** in the **INTERFACE** menu. See *INTERFACE* on page 3-17. Since the Automatic Interface Selection mode has been factory set to **ON**, simply connect the interface cable to the printer. (Note: Always turn off both your computer and printer when connecting or disconnecting the cable).



When you use the Automatic Interface Selection, note the following:

- This function takes a few seconds to work. If you want to speed up printing, select the required interface manually by using the control panel to access **SELECT** in the **INTERFACE** menu.

If you typically use only one interface, we recommend that you select that interface in the **INTERFACE** mode. If only one interface is selected, the printer will allocate the entire input buffer to that interface.

## Printer settings

### Factory settings

---

The printer settings have been set at the factory before shipment. They are called factory settings. Although you can operate the printer with these factory settings unchanged, you can tailor the printer with user settings. See *List of factory settings* on page 3-22.



Changing the user settings does not affect the factory settings. You cannot modify the present factory settings.

The changed user settings can be restored to the default factory settings with the **RESET MENU** menu. See *RESET MENU* on page 3-17.

# 3 Control panel

## Control panel

This printer has one liquid crystal display (LCD), six buttons and two Light Emitting Diodes (LEDs) on the control panel. The display can show various messages with up to 16 characters in each of the two rows. The LEDs light to indicate the current printer status.

# Buttons

You can control the basic printer operations and change various printer settings with the six buttons (**Go**, **Job Cancel**, **+**, **-**, **Set**, **Back**).

Button		Operations
<b>Go</b>		Exit from the control panel menu, reprint settings, error messages and sleep mode.
<b>Job Cancel</b>		Stop and cancel the print job in progress.
<b>Menu</b>	<b>+</b>	Move forward through menus. Move forward through the options you can choose.
	<b>-</b>	Move backward through menus. Move backward through the options you can choose.
	<b>Set</b>	Select the control panel menu. Set the selected menus and settings.
	<b>Back</b>	Go back one level in the menu.

## Go button

---

You can change the panel indications from the current status (Menu, Error and Reprint settings) by pressing the **Go** button once. For ERROR indications, the control panel only changes when the error is cleared.

You can pause printing with the **Go** button. Pressing the **Go** button again restarts the print job and clears the pause. During a pause, the printer is off-line.



If the printer is in PAUSE mode and you do not want to print the data that is left, you can cancel the job by pressing the **Job Cancel** button. Once the job has been canceled, the printer will return to the READY state.

## Job Cancel button

---

You can cancel the processing or printing of data with the **Job Cancel** button. The display shows JOB CANCELLING until the job is cancelled. After cancelling the job, the printer returns to the READY state.

When the printer is not receiving data or printing, the display shows NO DATA!!! and you cannot cancel the job.

## + or - button

---

If you press the + or - button when the printer is in the on-line (Ready) state, it goes off-line and the LCD displays the menu.

### To move through menus in the LCD

If you press the + or - button when the printer is in the on-line state, it goes off-line and the LCD displays the current mode.

You can go to other menus by pressing the + or - button. Pressing the + or - button allows you to move forward or backward through the menus and settings on the display. Press or keep pressing the button until you see the setting you want.

### To enter numbers

You can enter numbers in two ways. You can press the + or - button to move up or down one number at a time, or you can hold down the + or - button to move faster. When you see the number you want, press the **Set** button.

## Set button

---

If you press the **Set** button when the printer is in the on-line (Ready) state, it goes off-line and the LCD goes to the menu.

Pressing the **Set** button allows you to choose the displayed menu or option. After changing the setting, an asterisk (\*) appears briefly on the right-hand side of the message.

## Back button

---

If you press the **Back** button when the printer is in the on-line (Ready) state, it goes off-line and the LCD goes to the menu.

Pressing the **Back** allows you to return to the previous level from the current menu level.

The **Back** button also allows you to select the previous digit while setting numbers.

When you select the leftmost digit, the **Back** button allows you to go up one level in the menu.

When you select a setting and it does not have an asterisk (\*) (**Set** button was not pressed), the **Back** button allows you to return to the previous menu level with the original setting unchanged.



When you press the **Set** button to choose a setting, an asterisk appears briefly at the end of the display. Since the asterisk shows what you have chosen, you can easily see the current settings as you look through the display.

## Light-emitting diodes (LEDs)

The LED is a light that shows the printer status.

### Status LED (Green)

LED indication	Meaning
On	Ready to print Printing Sleeping Data remains in the printer buffer (when DATA EXISTS shows on the LCD).
Blinking	Receiving or processing data
Off	Off-line

### Alarm LED (Red)

LED indication	Meaning
On	There is an error in the printer.
Off	There is no error in the printer.

# Liquid crystal display (LCD)

The display shows the current printer status. When you use the control panel buttons, the display will change.


If you take the printer off-line, the display changes to show the emulation you have chosen.

If there are any problems, the display shows the appropriate error message, maintenance message, or call service message so you will know that you need to take action. For more information about these messages, see *Troubleshooting* in Chapter 6.

## LCD messages

---

The message on the LCD display shows the current printer status during normal operation as shown below.



The ■ marks indicate the status of the toner in the toner cartridges (K: Black, C: Cyan, M: Magenta, Y: Yellow). When the ■ mark blinks (□), the indicated toner is nearly empty. When toner becomes empty, the ■ indicator disappears completely.

When an error has occurred, the type of error is displayed on the first line of the LCD message as shown below.

The message on the second line shows information for clearing the error as shown below.



## Printer status messages

## How to use the control panel

When you use the **Menu** buttons (+, -, **Set** or **Back**), remember the following basic steps:

- If no control panel operations are performed for 30 seconds, the LCD automatically returns to Ready state.
- When you press the **Set** button to choose a setting, an asterisk appears briefly at the end of the display. After that, the display returns to the previous menu level.
- After changing the status or a setting, pressing the **Back** button before you press the **Set** button will cause the display to return to the previous menu level with the original settings unchanged.
- There are two ways to input numbers. You can press the + or - button to scroll up or down one number at a time, or you can hold down + or - to scroll faster. The blinking number is the one that you can change.

**For example: If you only use Tray 1 to print from, change the SOURCE setting to TRAY1, as follows:**

Many software applications support this type of laser printer. Using this mode will allow your printer to operate at its best with those applications.

### BR-Script3 mode

BR-Script is an original Brother page description language and a PostScript® language emulation interpreter. This printer supports level 3. The BR-Script interpreter of this printer allows you to control text and graphics on pages.

### EPSON FX-850 and IBM Proprinter XL mode

The EPSON FX-850 and IBM Proprinter XL modes are the emulation modes that this printer supports to meet the industry-standard for dot matrix printers. Some applications support these dot matrix printer emulations. Use these emulation modes so your printer will work well when printing from those types of applications.

## Reprint setting

---

If you want to reprint a document that has just been printed, you can reprint it by using the control panel button. Also, if you have created a document that you wish to share with colleagues, simply spool the document to a non-secure area of the printer. This document can then be reprinted by anyone who is on the network or at the printer control panel.

If you want to print PROOF, PUBLIC or SECURE data, we recommend that you install the optional CompactFlash® card.

### Reprinting from RAM

If you do not install a CompactFlash® card (see *CompactFlash® card* on page 4-11), you can reprint from random access memory (RAM). The reprint data in RAM will be deleted when the printer is turned off.

When you use RAM to reprint:

- 1 Press the **Set** button on the control panel to exit from the READY state and select **RAMDISK SIZE** in the **SETUP** menu.
  - 2 The pre-set RAM disk is 0MB. Press the **+** button to increase the reprint RAM size in increments of 1MB.
-  ■ When you increase the RAM size for Secure Printing, the work area of the printer is decreased and the printer performance will be reduced. Make sure that you reset the **RAMDISK SIZE** to 0MB after you finish using Secure Printing.
  - You can also save macros, the print log, and fonts on RAMDISK.
  - When you store data in RAM, the data will be deleted when the printer is turned off.

We recommend that you add more RAM if you want to be able to print a lot of secured data. (See *SO-DIMM* on page 4-13)

## Reprinting the last job

You can reprint the data from the last print job without sending it from the computer again.



- If you want to cancel reprinting, press the **Job Cancel** button.
- If the printer does not have enough memory to spool the print job data, it will print only the last page. We recommend that you expand the memory when you want to reprint a large amount of data. For more information on memory expansion, see *SO-DIMM memory* on page 4-1.
- For information about the settings in the printer driver, see *Job Spooling* on page 2-6.

## Reprint the last job three times

**1** Turn the REPRINT setting ON by using the control panel buttons to go to the **SETUP** menu.



If you print using the driver we have supplied with the printer, the settings for Job Spooling in the printer driver will take priority over the settings made on the control panel. See *Job Spooling* on page 2-6.

- Pressing the + or - button makes the number of reprint copies decrease or increase. You can select between 1 and 999 COPIES.
- If you wait 30 seconds to continue the control panel operation, the display leaves the **REPRINT** setting automatically.

## Printing PROOF data

You can use this setting to reprint PROOF data that has just been printed and has no security settings. Documents that are placed in the PROOF area are available to anyone. You might use this setting for a document that will be moved to a public folder at a later date.

When the area to spool data is full, the earliest data is automatically deleted first. The order of deleting data is not connected to the order of reprinting.

When you reprint PROOF data, please see *How to print SECURE data* on page 3-30.

## Printing PUBLIC data

You can use this setting to reprint documents that are stored in a PUBLIC area of the printer memory. Documents here will not be protected by a password and anyone can access them using the control panel or a web browser. The printer will not print a PUBLIC document when you send it to the printer. You must use the control panel of the printer or connect to the printer through a web browser.

PUBLIC data can be deleted using the control panel of the printer or from the web-based management software.

When you reprint PUBLIC data, please see *How to print SECURE data* on page 3-30.

## Printing SECURE data

SECURE documents are protected by a password and only those people who know the password will be able to print the document. The printer will not print the document when you send it for printing. If you want to delete the spooled data, you can carry out this operation using the control panel or the web-based management software.

## Lower tray unit (LT-27CL)

The lower tray unit (Tray 2) is an optional device that can hold up to 530 sheets of extra paper (75 g/m<sup>2</sup> or 20 lb). You can put Letter, A4, B5 (JIS and ISO) or Executive size (176x250 to 215.9x297mm) paper in this tray. If you want to buy the optional lower tray unit, call the dealer you bought the printer from.

### Putting paper in the lower tray unit

---

After you have installed the lower paper tray, you can put paper in it the same way you put paper in the upper paper tray.

### How to install the lower tray unit

---

- ▲ ■ This printer is heavy and weighs approximately 31.5 kg (69.4 lb). To prevent injuries, use at least two people to lift the printer.
- When you lift the printer make sure you use the handholds at the bottom four corners of the printer.
- When placing the printer on top of the lower tray unit, be careful not to catch your fingers between them.
- Do not carry the printer when the lower tray unit and/or the duplex unit are attached.

#### ! Caution

When moving or lifting this printer, keep the printer flat. To avoid spills, you must first remove the toner cartridges and waste toner pack.

- 1 Turn off the printer power switch and unplug the printer.
- 2 Place the lower tray unit on a flat table, and then remove the protective parts.








**Figure 4-2**







## Legal tray (LT-27LG)

If you wish to print on Legal size paper, you must use the Legal tray. However, since it is not restricted to Legal size paper, you can choose to load Letter, A4, B5 (JIS/ISO), Executive, A5 or envelopes in this tray. If you want to buy the optional legal tray, call the dealer you bought the printer from.

### How to install the legal tray




**Figure 4-10**

# Duplex unit (DX-2700)

The duplex unit is an optional device that allows you to print on both sides of a piece of paper. You can print on Letter, A4, B5 (JIS/ISO), Executive, A5 and Legal size paper. When it is installed, you can select either duplex printing or simplex printing on the control panel or with a software command. See *PAPER* on page 3-11 for details about the menu setting.

## How to install the duplex unit

---

- ▲ ■ This printer is heavy and weighs approximately 31.5 kg (69.4 lb). To prevent injuries, use at least two people to lift the printer.
- When you lift the printer, be sure to use the handholds at the bottom four corners of the printer.
- Do not carry the printer when the lower tray unit and/or the duplex unit are attached.

### ! Caution

When moving or lifting this printer, keep the printer flat. To avoid spills, you must first remove the toner cartridges and waste toner pack.

- 1 Turn off the printer power switch and unplug the printer.
- 2 Remove the duplex upper cover, duplex lower cover and duplex cap at the back of the printer. We recommend removing the covers and the cap with a coin or a screwdriver.




**Figure 4-15**


**Figure 4-16**


**Figure 4-17**


**Figure 4-18**

## Guidelines for printing on both sides of the paper

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- If the paper is thin, it may wrinkle.
- If paper is curled, straighten it and place it in the paper tray.
- If the paper is not feeding properly, it may be curled. Remove the paper and straighten it.

### Paper orientation for printing on both sides of the paper

The printer prints the second page first. If you print 10 pages on 5 sheets of paper, it will print page 2 followed by page 1 on the first sheet of paper.

It will print page 4 followed by page 3 on the second sheet of paper. It will print page 6 followed by page 5 on the third sheet of paper, and so on.

For duplex printing, you must put the paper in the paper tray in the following way:

Put the side to be printed on first, face down, with the leading edge (top) of the paper at the back of the tray. If letterhead paper is used, put it in the paper tray with the heading face up, and at the back of the tray.

This printer has a slot for an optional CompactFlash® card. If you install an optional CompactFlash® card, you can save macros, the print log, and fonts on it. You can also select your print job and reprint it through the network.



We recommend that you expand the printer memory to avoid any MEMORY FULL errors.

The HL-2700CN printer has 64 MB of standard memory and a slot for optional additional memory. The memory can be expanded up to a total of 576 MB by installing a commercially available SO-DIMM (Dual In-line Memory Module).

The printer uses memory modules that are:

144 pins, no-parity, SDRAM with 64 MB or more.

The printer is not compatible with Extended Data Output (EDO) DIMM.


## Installing additional memory


**Figure 4-22**




**Figure 4-23**

## Selecting the optional fonts

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After you have installed the optional font card, you can select optional fonts using any of the following methods:

- 1 Through your application software
- 2 With a font selection command
- 3 With the control panel menu settings.

When you select fonts through your application software, follow the instructions specific to your software. See your software manual if you need assistance. When you select fonts with a font selection command, embed the font selection command in your program. See the *Technical Reference Manual*. Call a Brother authorized service representative or Brother Customer Service for references to the *Technical Reference Manual*.



When you select the fonts through your software or with a command, note the following:

- You do not need to be concerned about the font control panel setting. The software or command overrides the printer setting.
- Be sure to install a font package that has the fonts you want. The printer automatically selects the font that has exactly the same or similar characteristics as those you have set through the software or with a command. If the installed font package does not happen to have a font of similar characteristics, the printer will print in an unexpected font.

To select fonts with the control panel setting menu, follow these basic steps:

- 1 Press any of the **Menu** buttons (+, -, **Set** or **Back**) to take the printer off line.
- 2 Press + or - until **INFORMATION** appears on the LCD display.
- 3 Press **Set** to proceed to the next menu level, and then press + or - until **PRINT FONTS** appears.
- 4 Press **Set** to print the list of optional fonts (Figure 4-23).
- 5 Find the font number on the list.




The following are maintenance messages that appear on the LCD panel in the READY state. These messages provide advanced warnings to replace the consumable items before they run out. To avoid any inconvenience, you may wish to buy spare consumable items before the printer stops printing.

The toner cartridges that come supplied with this printer, are starter toners.

Starter toners, are toner cartridges with up to half the life of the standard toner cartridge, 5000 pages (Black) and 3000 pages (Cyan, Magenta and Yellow) at approximately 5% print coverage (A4 or Letter size).

\*2 For example, if the Cyan and Magenta toner cartridges are almost empty, the indication will be

If the Cyan and Magenta toner cartridges are empty, the ■ indicator will have disappeared.

\*3 Definition of pages: actual output page number.

Definition of images:

If the image on a page contains only one color of either Cyan, Magenta, Yellow or Black =>1 image, two colors => 2 images, three colors => 3 images, four colors => 4 images.



- Discard the used consumable item according to local regulations, keeping it separate from domestic waste. If you have questions, call your local waste disposal office. Be sure to re-seal the consumable item tightly so that the material inside does not spill.
- We recommend placing used consumable items on a piece of paper or cloth to prevent accidentally spilling or scattering the material inside.



- If you use paper that is not a direct equivalent for the recommended paper, the life of consumable items and printer parts may be reduced.
- The projected life for each of the items listed is based on an average of 5% coverage of the printable area using any color toner cartridge. Frequency of replacement will vary depending on the complexity of printed pages, percentage of coverage and type of media used.

## Toner cartridges

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A new toner cartridge contains enough toner to print up to 10,000 pages for Black and up to 6,600 pages for Cyan, Magenta and Yellow A4 or Letter-size single-sided pages at about 5% coverage.



- The amount of toner used varies depending on how much print is on the page and the print density setting.
- If you change the print density setting for lighter or darker printing, the amount of toner that is used will change.
- Wait to unpack the toner cartridge until immediately before you install it in the printer.

### Toner nearly empty message

Check printed pages, page counter, and display messages regularly. If the  indicator starts blinking, the printer has nearly run out of toner or the toner is not evenly distributed inside the cartridge.



\*K stands for Black, C stands for Cyan, M stands for Magenta and Y stands for Yellow.

Although you can print up to 300 (Black) and 500 (Cyan, Magenta and Yellow) additional pages (at 5% coverage) after the **TONER LOW** message first appears, be sure to replace the toner cartridge with a new one before it becomes completely empty. When this occurs, the  indicator on the LCD panel will disappear.



We also strongly recommend that you continue to use only Genuine Brother Brand replacement toner cartridges. Using or attempting to use potentially incompatible toner and /or toner cartridges in your printer may cause damage to the printer itself and/or it may result in unsatisfactory print quality. Our warranty coverage does not apply to any problem that was caused by the use of unauthorized third party toner and toner cartridges. To protect your investment and guarantee your print quality please continue to replace consumed toner cartridges with only Genuine Brother Branded Supplies.

■ Printing with a third-party toner or third-party toner cartridges may reduce not only the print quality but also the quality and life of the printer itself. It may also cause serious damage to the performance and life of a drum unit. Warranty coverage does not apply to problems caused by the use of third-party toner or third-party toner cartridges.

 We recommend that you clean the printer when you replace the toner cartridge. See *Cleaning* on page 5-21.

To replace the toner cartridge, follow these steps:

**1** Open the front cover of the printer.






**Figure 5-2**

- ! ■ Wait to unpack the toner cartridge until immediately before you put it in the printer. If toner cartridges are left unpacked for a long time, the toner life will be shortened.
- Put the toner cartridge into the printer immediately after you have removed the protective cover. To prevent degradation to the print quality, do not touch the shaded parts shown in Figure 5-3.

- 5** Put in the new toner cartridge by positioning it in the guide. Slide it gently into the printer. Do not try to push or lock the new toner cartridge in; it must rest loosely in the guide rails and will automatically be properly positioned when the front cover is closed. Note that each color cartridge is individually keyed to prevent improper installation. Match each cartridge color label to the same color label on the printer.

- Slide the toner cartridges into the printer *gently*. Do not try to lock them into the printer by pushing them. They must stay loosely in the guide rails so they will be properly positioned when the front cover is closed.
- If you use consumable items other than genuine Brother supplies or if you use refilled toner cartridges, the printer could be damaged or might not work properly. This may void your warranty.
- Do not stand a toner cartridge on its end or turn it upside down.

## Waste toner pack

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After you have printed approximately 12,000 images at 5% coverage, you must change the waste toner pack.

## Replace OPC belt cartridge message

When the OPC belt cartridge runs out, the following message appears on the LCD. When you see this message, you must replace the OPC belt cartridge:



- ❗ ■ Do not touch the surface of the OPC belt cartridge. If you touch it, it could degrade print quality.
- Do not expose the OPC belt cartridge to light (more than 800 lux) for more than 2 minutes. This could degrade print quality.
- Damage caused by improper handling of the OPC belt cartridge may void your warranty.


**Figure 5-10**


**Figure 5-11**




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### Replace fusing unit message


**Figure 5-17**




- It is also recommended that your dealer or Brother Customer Service replace the paper pick-up roller, separator pad and transfer belt.
- When you replace the transfer belt cleaner and transfer roller, please follow the instructions. See *Replacing the transfer belt cleaner* on page 5-16 and *Replacing the transfer roller* on page 5-18. Replacement of only the transfer belt cleaner and the transfer roller is not a full 120K service and the counter should not be reset until these additional parts are replaced.

### Replacing the transfer belt cleaner




Both ends of the transfer belt cleaner roller consist of metal bearings that connect the bias element to the power supply. These must be connected properly when you install the transfer belt cleaner. Be sure to check how to connect them properly by looking at the old transfer belt cleaner before you begin replacement.


**Figure 5-20**


**Figure 5-21**




**Figure 5-24**






**Figure 5-26**




**Figure 5-27**

# Cleaning

Clean the outside and inside of the printer regularly with a dry soft cloth. When you replace the toner cartridge, make sure you clean the inside of the printer. If printed pages are stained with toner, clean the inside of the printer with a dry soft cloth.



- Use *water*. Cleaning with volatile liquids such as thinner or benzine will damage the surface of the printer.
- Do not use cleaning materials that contain ammonia. They could damage the printer, particularly the toner cartridges.

We recommend cleaning the following parts of the printer every 20,000 printed pages or every 12 months:



## Cleaning the outside of the printer

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
Clean the outside of the printer as follows:

- 1** Turn off the printer power switch and unplug the printer.
- 2** Take the paper tray out of the printer.
- 3** Wipe the outside of the printer with a soft cloth to remove dust. Dip the cloth in water and wring it out thoroughly for cleaning.



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

- Never touch or clean the transfer roller because print quality may be adversely affected.
- Be careful not to inhale the toner.








**Figure 5-33**




**Figure 5-34**




**Figure 5-36**




**Figure 5-37**






**Figure 5-40**


**Figure 5-42**






**Figure 5-44**

## Shipping the printer

- ▲ ■ Once your printer has been set-up and used, we do not recommend that it be moved or shipped unless absolutely necessary.
- Color laser printers are complex printing devices. Moving the printer or shipping it without properly removing the installed supplies can result in SEVERE damage to the printer. As a result, your printer may not operate properly afterwards.

# 6 Troubleshooting

 If you do not follow the instructions for using the printer, you may be responsible for all repairs.

## LCD messages

If any problems occur, the printer automatically stops printing, diagnoses the problem, and displays the resulting message on the LCD to alert you. Take the appropriate action, referring to the following tables. If you cannot clear the problem, call the dealer you bought the printer from or Brother Customer Service.



The control panel LCD names for the paper trays are as follows.

- Standard paper tray: TRAY1
- Optional lower tray: TRAY2
- Optional duplex unit: DX

## Paper jams and how to clear them

If paper jams inside the printer, the printer will stop. One of the following LCD messages will appear to tell you where to find the jammed paper.



JAM B	Paper jam at the entrance to the fusing roller.
JAM C	Paper jam where the paper comes out of the printer.

JAM E	Paper jam in the upper assembly of the duplex unit

Paper may jam in the paper tray, inside the printer, at the back cover, or where the paper comes out of the printer. Check where the jam is and follow the instructions on the next few pages to remove the jammed paper.

If the error message still appears on the LCD after you remove the jammed paper, there may be more paper jammed somewhere else. Please check the printer thoroughly.

After you have followed the instructions, the printer will resume printing automatically. However, the Status LED may come on and the following message may appear on the display:

PAUSE

After a paper jam has occurred, data usually stays in the printer memory. The message prompts you to do a form feed to print the data that is left. Press **Go** to continue.

- Do not touch the toner surface of the jammed paper. It might stain your hands or clothes.
- After removing the jammed paper, and the next printed page is stained with toner, print several test pages before restarting your print job.
- Remove the jammed paper carefully to prevent spreading toner.
- Take care not to stain your hands and clothes. Wash toner stains immediately with cold water.
- Never touch the transfer roller.
- If the paper in the paper tray is creased at the edges, paper jams can occur. To prevent this, please turn the paper over.



Do not use the following paper:

- Bent/curled paper
- Moist paper
- Paper that does not meet specifications


**Figure 6-5**


**Figure 6-7**

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




**Figure 6-8**


**Figure 6-9**




**Figure 6-17**







# Improving the print quality



If you are having problems with print quality, please do a test print first (press the **Set** button 3 times). If the problem appears on the printout, then match it to one of the examples below and follow the recommendation. If the problem does not appear on the test print, please check driver settings and the interface cables as the problem may not lie with printer.

 You can resolve a print quality problem by replacing a toner cartridge with a new one when the toner indicators start blinking or the LCD shows the **TONER EMPTY** message.
