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
I've been using the Brother™ ScanNCut machine to make all kinds of things – like batches of these cute duct tape earrings to give away to friends. The process is super easy because you can scan in your design, size it how you want and then multiply the design to cover an entire sheet of paper or fabric (or, in my case – a sheet of duct tape!).

MATERIALS:

Brother™ ScanNCut machine, assorted sheets of duct tape, hole punch, earring findings

step 1.

Scan in your design (or use images from the machine's graphic library). Size and place how you want them to cut on your sheet of duct tape. Turn your blade to the number "6", and then place the sheet of duct tape on the mat. Use an old gift card as a squeegee to press out any bubbles (you want the sheet to be secured to the standard mat). Load the mat and press "Cut".



Tip: Always perform a test cut.



step 2.

You'll end up with lots of shapes and sizes of designs. You can press them together (as I did here with the "Skull" design), or you can expose the adhesive and pour glitter over it.



step 3.

Use a hole punch for the tops, and then add the jewelry hooks.
