Does your little one need some help getting to sleep? Here's a fun dreamcatcher project you both can create which will help her to get some shut-eye.

#### MATERIALS:

CM650W ScanNCut Machine and Accessories; ScanNCutCanvas; Feather Cut File (FREE on the ScanNCutCanvas Site from the "Feather Cushion Cover" Project); 10" Embroidery Hoop; 8.5" x 11" White Cardstock; 12" x 12" Navy Blue Cardstock; Fabric; Ribbons; Black Pen; Scissors; Hot Glue Gun and Glue Sticks; Studs or Other Embellishments (Optional)

**step 1.** Place the navy blue cardstock onto the cutting mat and insert it into your ScanNCut. Click on 'Patterns' and then the 'Designs' icon (it looks like a flower and a gift), and then scroll to the 'Doilies' section and click on it. Choose doily pattern AR-0007 and resize it to 9.90" before cutting it out.





**step 2.** Use your scissors to snip a 1" long slit in the edge of your fabric and then rip it the length of the fabric. Do this a couple of times. Separate the two sections of the embroidery hoop and wrap the fabric pieces around both pieces of the embroidery hoop, gluing it in place with hot glue.



**step 3.** Use hot glue to adhere the doily onto the smaller section of the embroidery hoop and then place the larger embroidery hoop around the smaller one.



**step 4.** Download the free feather cut file from the "Feather Cushion Cover" project on ScanNCutCanvas. Create a new project in ScanNCutCanvas and then click on the 'Import File' button, and select the cut file. Duplicate and resize the feather so that you have three feathers (approximately 4" long) and two feathers (about 3.5" long). Load white cardstock into the ScanNCut. Cut them out.

**step 5.** Use a black pen to draw doodles on the feathers.

**step 6.** Using hot glue, adhere multiple 20" lengths of ribbon to the bottom of the dreamcatcher and then adhere the feathers randomly onto the ribbons.

**step 7.** To tighten the larger hoop around the smaller one, insert a piece of ribbon through both holes on the hardware and tie it in a bow.



**step 8.** Add extra embellishments if desired.
