Embroider this black, gray, white, and burgundy set using exclusive designs built into the Brother Isodore™ Innov-ís 5000 Sewing and Embroidery machine. Use the included Brother Pacesetter BES® Monogramming Suite software for the exquisite lettering on the pillow and throw. New pillows, curtains, and a cozy throw are the perfect way to make a stylish statement for any room in your home! We hope these instructions will inspire you to create your own custom home décor!

#### **Materials and Supplies**

- Brother Laura Ashley Isodore™ Innov-ís 5000
  Sewing and Embroidery Machine
- <u>Brother Pacesetter BES® Monogramming Suite</u> <u>Software</u> included with the machine.
- Brother Embroidery Threads
- Brother Bobbin Thread
- <u>SA5820</u> Brother Pacesetter® Medium weight Tear Away Stabilizer for embroidering white linen.
- Temporary Spray adhesive specifically made for embroidery. Attach the tear away stabilizer using this spray adhesive.
- <u>SA5906</u> Brother Pacesetter® Lightweight Adhesive Backed Water Soluble Stabilizer for embroidered appliqués on sheer fabric.
- <u>SA541</u> Brother Pacesetter® Lightweight Water Soluble Stabilizer for free standing floral embroidery on sheer fabric.
- Purchase various home décor fabrics and ribbon trim for constructing pillow, curtains, and curtain tiebacks. Yardage will vary according to your personal requirements.
- Sheer gray polyester organza for free standing flowers, approximately ½ yard.
- Sheer burgundy polyester organza for tie back circles, approximately ¼ yard.
- Rectangular pillow form for Home Sweet Home pillow.
- Pre-purchased burgundy plush throw for monogramming.
- Two pre-purchased leather or leather like burgundy pillows.
- Seam Sealant for treating edges of free standing flowers.
- Clear fabric glue for attaching flowers to pillows.
- Basic sewing notions to complete the projects.









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# **Instructions for Creating the Home Sweet Home Pillow**

- 1. Use the included Pacesetter BES® Monogramming Suite software to create the Home Sweet Home lettering design for the center of an oblong pillow. Embroider on a rectangle of firm white linen adding the built in Laura Ashley scroll design No. 36 at each end. Note that the lettering is not a traditional monogram. It is necessary to create each line of Home, Sweet, Home line by line in the software. Begin by selecting a new page and then clicking the Monogram Designer icon. Re-select the icon to add each new line. \*See **Figure #1** for details.
- 2. Sew the embroidered linen to a larger rectangle of burgundy fabric and trim with gray satin ribbon. Cut fabric pieces to fit your purchased form and construct the pillow using your favorite method.


### **Instructions for Creating the Monogrammed Throw**

- Create a three letter monogram for the throw using Pacesetter BES® Monogramming Suite software.
   \*See Figure #2.
- Open the design in the Edit mode of the machine and create an Appliqué using the special Appliqué Creator function built in to the machine. Embroider the monogram design using burgundy organza stabilized with the adhesive backed water soluble. When finished, dissolve stabilizer and attach appliqué to the throw.



### **Instructions for Creating the Floral Appliqué Pillows**

 Open motif No.22, size large in the Edit mode of the machine. \*See **Figure #3**. Create an Appliqué using the special Appliqué Creator function built in to the machine. For the fabric, use gray polyester organza stabilized with adhesive backed water soluble. Embroider a second motif in the same manner. When finished, dissolve stabilizer and dry thoroughly. Use the clear glue to attach appliqués to purchased pillows.






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# **Instructions for Creating the Rosette Tie Backs and Coordinating Curtains**

- Embroider two of the small No.22 built in motifs onto a piece of gray organza sandwiched between two layers of the water soluble stabilizer. When finished, dissolve stabilizer and dry thoroughly. Treat the edges of each flower with the seam sealant. Let dry and trim away excess fabric.
- 2. Use the circular sewing attachment to create two double faced, (lined) circles from 6-inch squares of burgundy organza. Run a basting stitch in the center area of each finished circle to gather the circle slightly. Use hand sewing stitches to attach each free standing flower to the center of each organza circle.
- 3. Cut and sew tie backs to size and trim centers with gray ribbon. Attach a flower combination to each tie back using safety pins.
  - \*See Figure #4.
- 4. Construct matching curtains from the tieback fabric. Add complimentary sheers to round out the set.


