Scan Cut HANDMADE FABRIC projects

I love making my own fabric that I can use in my mixed media sewing projects. And while there are all kinds of ways to create colorful fabric, my favorite is to use one of a kind stencils to create pattern.

MATERIALS:

Brother™ ScanNCut machine, thick card stock paper, non-aerosol fabric spray paint , fabric dye, mister

step 1.





I used my Brother™ ScanNCut to create some fun stencils! To begin, I created a stencil with triangles. I used the built-in triangle shape and repeated it to create a simple geometric pattern. Using thick paper, I cut out the stencil.

Tip: Secure the thick paper gently to the standard mat. Always be sure to do a test cut.

step 2. Next, I used my non-aerosol spray paint to repeat my triangle stencil across the surface of my fabric!

step 3. I wanted to get a little more detailed with my stencils so I scanned one of my flower doodles into my Brother™ ScanNCut, and then cut out the design from thick cardstock.





step 4. I used a mister - loaded with fabric dye - and repeated my stencil across the surface of my fabric.
